Hodge of Ballast Bay, Tortola, celebrated with family, friends and well-wishers at the launch of her book entitled: “Real Family Jokes”. In her remarks, Dr. Hodge stated: “First of all, I thank God for this beautiful day and for His presence here with us. This book has been long in coming - from the time Noah was building the ark. Deputy Director of Culture, Ms. Anne Lennard, and the Department of Information and Public Relations staff also contributed to the event, with best regards also sent on behalf of the Ministry of Education, Youth Affairs and Sports. Mr. Keith Dawson, President of the Ivan Dawson Memorial Scholarship Committee, gave the closing remarks. He emphasised that the proceeds of book sales will go towards the scholarship fund, which was established in loving memory of the author’s father.
